State Operating Budget Process

The state budget establishes how much money will be available to run the state in the coming year, and how the money is divided up between programs and determines the rules on how the programs will work. The budget goes through many steps before it is approved for the upcoming fiscal year which runs from July 1 through June 30th.

Deliver budget priorities to and meet with Senators on SWM. Develop and find Representatives to sponsor budget amendments for the HWM budget debate week.
June	Senate budget	The SWM committee budget and amendments go before the full Senate for discussion, modification and vote (May or June). The Senate debates and offers amendments to the SWM budget. June–July	Overrides	The House and Senate can override vetoed sections of the budget or let them stand. Overrides must be supported by 2/3 ^{rds} of the both the House and Senate and need to be completed before July 31 st , the end of the formal legislative sessions. In some years, the schedule has been extended into August.	House Senate	Contact Representatives and Senators about veto overrides.
July	Final budget	The Legislature presents the final budget ("General Appropriations Act") to the Governor.	House Senate	Thank Representatives and Senators for their budget and efforts. Contact state agencies about implementation of budget initiatives.
