- 2. Prohibits use of operating fund \$ (or any future HUD appropriations) for federalized state units

 Requires operating fund be allocated with consideration of excess PHA reserves or if sufficient data not available pro-rata
- 3. Cuts percentage of funds grantees can spend on administrative costs from 20% to 10%
- 4. Explicitly prohibits use of FY2012 appropriations for Sustainable Communities activities (including staff, interagency activities)
- 5. Maintains minimum grant threshhold necessary to receive a formula allocation despite decline in appropriations.
- 6. Subcommittee draft proposed funding at \$50 million; amendment during mark-up added \$21.9 million.
